### Improve Affordability

<b>\$310 million Affordable Housing Bond</b> <b>File 150489</b> Places \$310 million Housing Bond on the November 2015 ballot that would provide funding to reconstruct public housing, accelerate construction of new affordable units, acquire existing rent controlled buildings and increase middle income loan programs. <b>Surplus Property Initiative Ordinance</b> <b>File 150659</b> Places an initiative ordinance on the November 2015 ballot that would establish a process by which sites or air rights are identified and transferred to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development for development of affordable housing.
