<p>A</p> <p>Retirement Benefits for City Employees</p>	<p>Makes pensioned city employees who retired before November 6, 1996, eligible for a continuous supplemental cost-of-living adjustment to their pension benefits. This measure would impact about 4,500 retirees.</p>	<p>SUPPORT</p>
<p>B</p> <p>Eliminate the Department of Sanitation and Streets</p>	<p>Eliminates the not yet formed Department of Sanitation and Streets saving the city millions in redundant administrative costs.</p>	<p>SUPPORT</p>
<p>C</p> <p>Homelessness Commission</p>	<p>Creates a new city commission to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.</p>	<p>SUPPORT</p>
<p>D</p> <p>Affordable Homes Now</p>	<p>Amends the San Francisco City Charter to speed up the approvals process for certain types of housing developments. Prevents eligible housing projects from being blocked or delayed for discretionary reasons if they meet the city's code.</p>	<p>SUPPORT</p>
<p>E</p> <p>Affordable Housing Production Act</p>	<p>Amends the City Charter to modify the approvals process for certain types of housing developments. Similar to Proposition D but has so many restrictions for projects to qualify that it would not speed up housing production.</p>	<p>OPPOSE</p>
<p>F</p> <p>Library Preservation Fund</p>	<p>Renews a property tax set aside to fund the San Francisco Public Library for the next 25 years.</p>	<p>SUPPORT</p>
<p>G</p> <p>Student Success Fund</p>	<p>Allocates excess Educational Revenue Augmentation Funds to San Francisco Unified School District schools for student enrichment and other services.</p>	<p>SUPPORT</p>

H City Elections in Even-Numbered Years	Moves San Francisco citywide elections to even-numbered years.	OPPOSE
I Vehicles on JFK Drive in Golden Gate Park and the Great Highway	Permenently reopens JFK Drive in Golden Gate Park and the Great Highway along Ocean Beach to car traffic.	NO POSITION
J Recreational Use of JFK Drive in Golden Gate Park	Reauthorizes the city's Golden Gate Park Access and Safety Program, which closed select roads in Golden Gate Park to car traffic.	NO POSITION
L Sales Tax for Transportation Projects	Continues the existing half-cent sales tax to fund transportation improvements without increasing the current tax rate.	SUPPORT
M Tax on Keeping Residential Units Vacant	Taxes homes that have been vacant for longer than six months.	OPPOSE
N Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility	Allows the City to use public funds to acquire and operate the Golden Gate Park Underground Parking Facility.	SUPPORT
O City College Parcel Tax	Creates a new parcel tax on residential and commercial properties in San Francisco that will fund City College.	OPPOSE
