## A

### Earthquake Safety and Emergency Response Bond

The Chamber supports Proposition A because it strengthens San Francisco's ability to respond to earthquakes, fires, and other major emergencies without raising tax rates. Reliable emergency infrastructure protects residents, workers, businesses, and job centers when disaster strikes, making Prop A a practical investment in public safety and economic resilience.



## B

### Lifetime Term Limits for Mayor and Members of the Board of Supervisors

Proposition B would create a lifetime two-term limit for the Mayor and Board of Supervisors, replacing the current rule that limits them to two consecutive terms. Proponents say this would prevent career politicians from cycling back into office, while opponents say it could limit voter choice and remove experienced leaders from public service. The Chamber has not taken a position on Proposition B.



## C

### Decreases to Business Taxes

Proposition C would raise San Francisco's small business tax exemption from \$5 million to \$7.5 million while making modest, predictable tax adjustments for larger businesses. The Chamber supports and sponsored Prop C because it cuts taxes for small businesses, asks large companies to contribute more in a feasible way, and protects San Francisco's economic recovery.



## D

### Increases to Business Tax Based on Comparison of Top Executive's Pay to Employees' Pay

Proposition D would raise San Francisco's gross receipts surcharge based on executive-to-worker pay ratios by 800%, using a global workforce calculation that could push more companies into much higher tax rates. The Chamber opposes Prop D because it would renege on the agreement made in 2024's Prop M, increase costs that may be passed on to customers, and risk slowing San Francisco's economic recovery.
